It has been a higgledy piggledy week in Nursery and the children have managed to squeeze an awful lot into just three days! This week they have been architects – they have been designing their own houses, deciding which materials they would make it out of, why? and what they are going to use to hold it all together.

This week we looked at the sound that the letter r makes: rrrrrrrrrr. It's a long stretchy sound that is found at the start of robot, rabbit, ring, rose, rain, rake, rug and rocket.



To form this letter we start at the top of the robots head, we go straight down to his feet, back up to his shoulder and out pops his arm with a fancy flick!

In our handwriting books this week we were practicing the letter g and the number 8.

The children have enjoyed being plumbers in the water tray, connecting the pipes to create channels for the water to flow through.



Well done to all of the children who have started coming into Nursery independently, after half term we are going to ask parents to start leaving their children at the bottom of the Nursery ramp, the children will come in, hang their coats on their pegs, find their names and come into the classroom independently. We are aiming to increase their levels of independence in preparation for Reception. Please feel free to start doing this sooner if you feel that your child is ready for it. Staff will still be available for you to talk to if necessary.

This week the children will be making their own sausage rolls.
